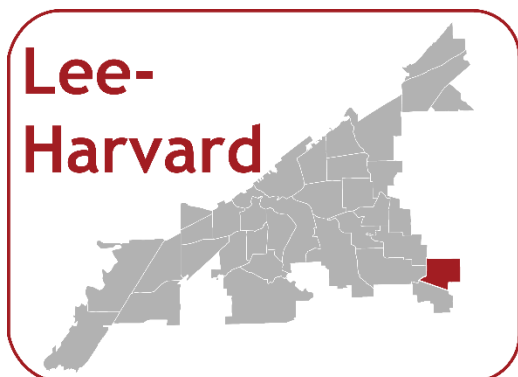

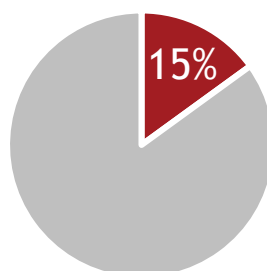

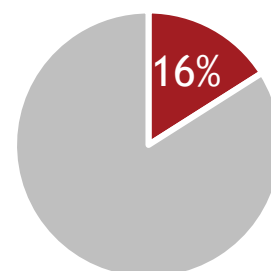
Percent of people with *no* health insurance coverage:

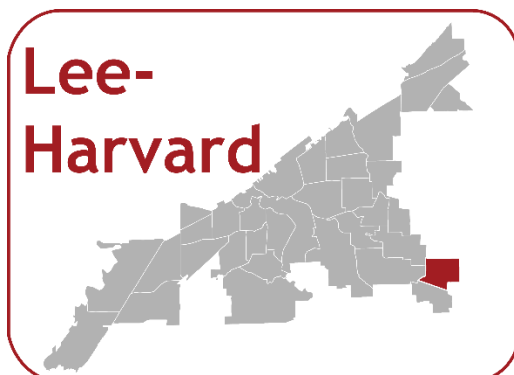
