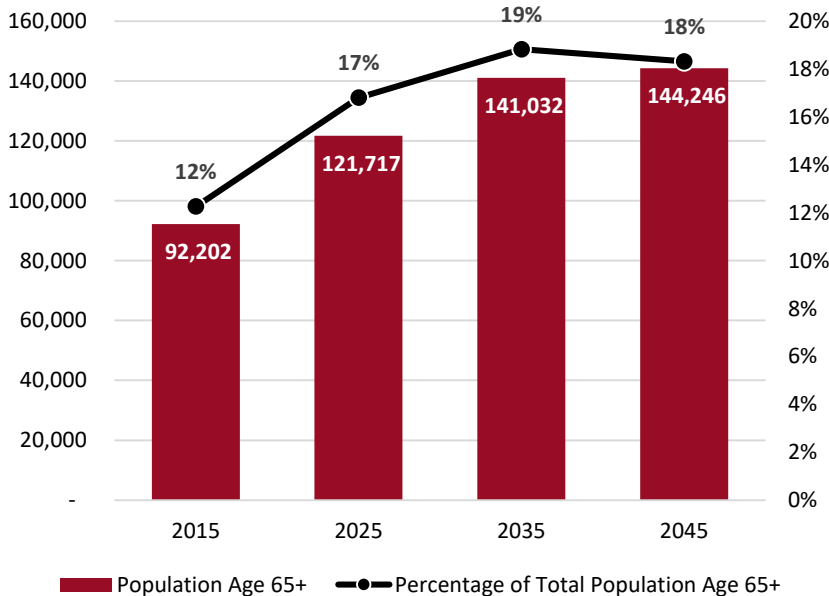

Housing

There are **wide disparities** in **home values** and **rents** throughout the DAAA region.

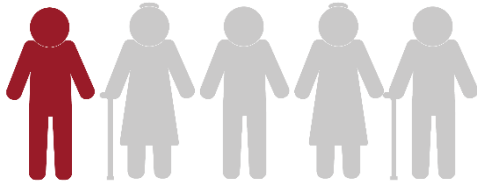


- The **highest home values** and **rents** in the region are in **Grosse Pointe Shores**, where the median home value is **\$455,000**, and median rent is **\$1,766**.
- The **lowest home values** in the region are in **Highland Park**, where the median home value is **\$33,500**, and median rent is **\$617**.

DAAA has completed over **1,800 home repair** projects in the region since 2017, an investment of about **\$3.9 Million**. This allows older adults to **age in place** with access to **safe housing**.



Poverty



About **1-in-5 older adults** in the DAAA region live in **poverty**, more than **double** the state rate.

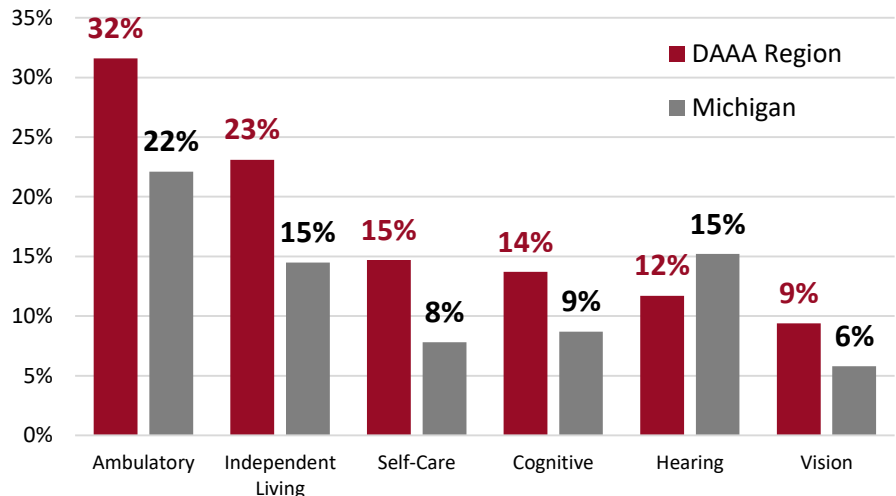

Percent of Older Adults with Disability, by Disability Type

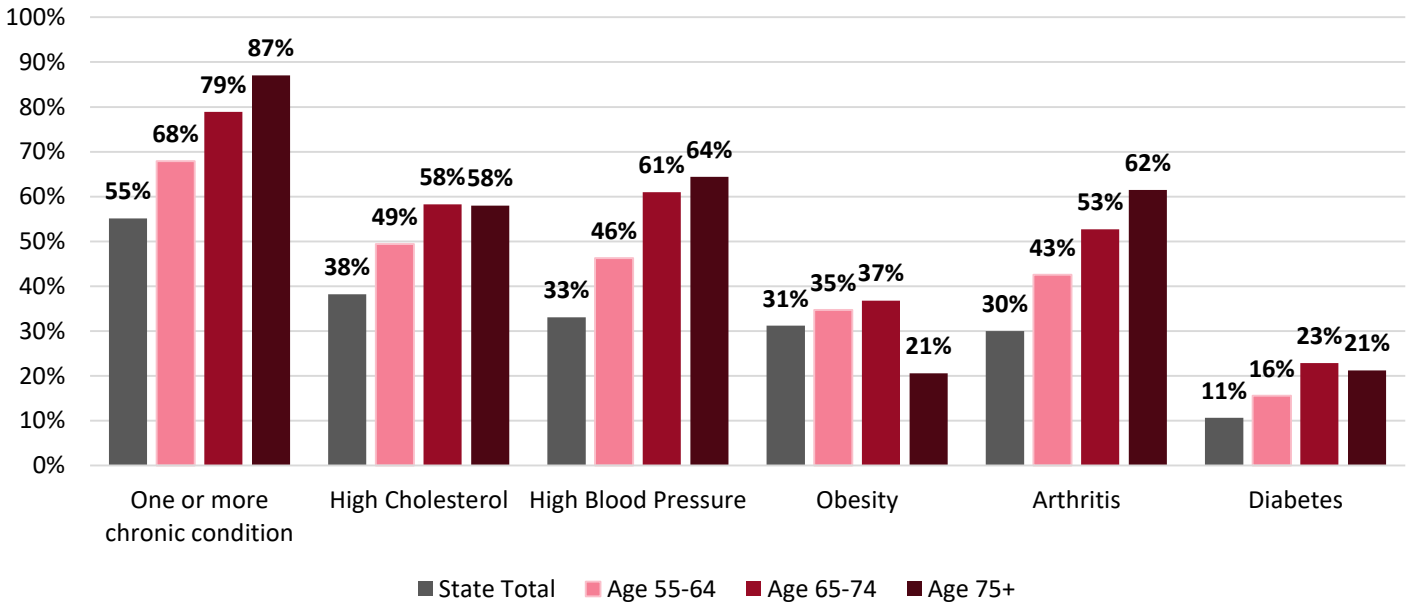

Health Issues

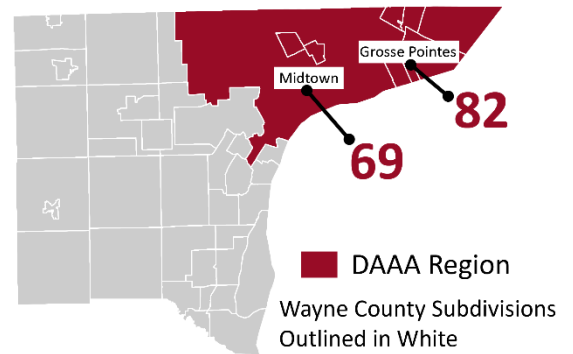
Prevalence of Chronic Diseases Among Michigan Older Adults Increases with Age



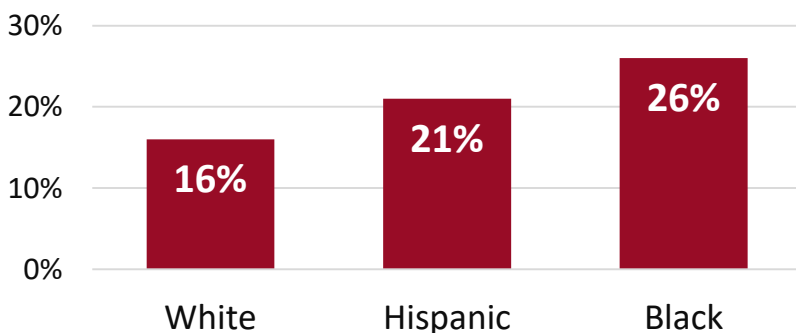
8,724 older adults in the DAAA region are estimated to have **Alzheimer's or dementia**. Due to under-reporting, there are likely even more older adults living with dementia.

Percent of People Who Reported Being in Fair or Poor Health, by Race



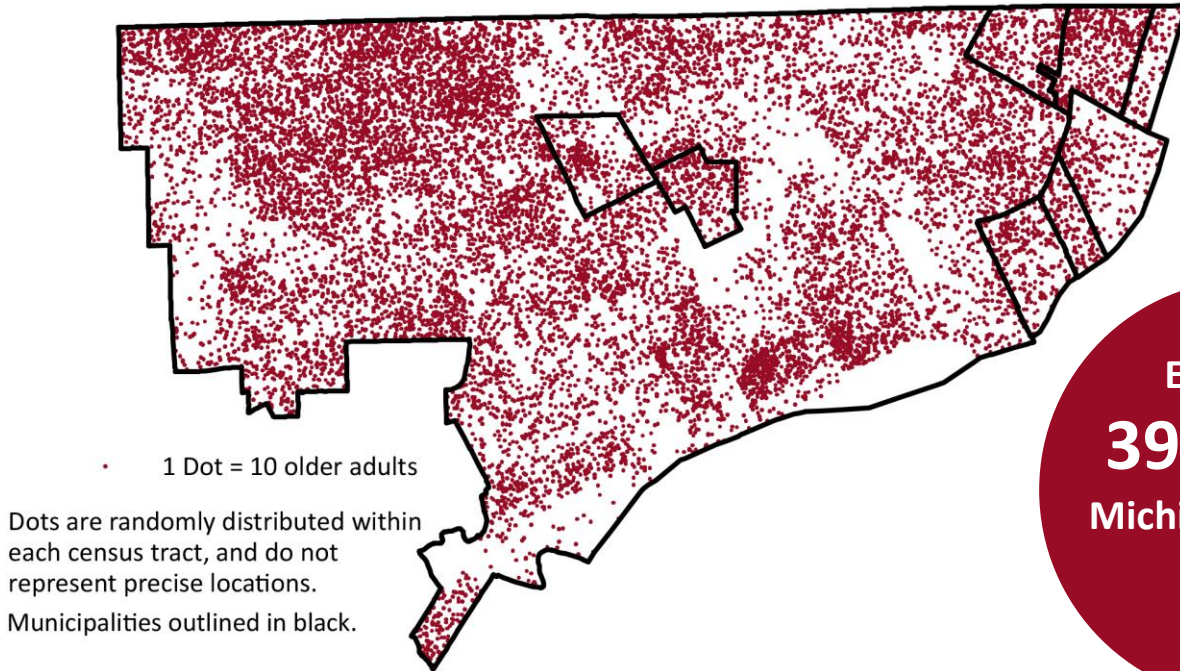
The average **life expectancy** of Midtown Detroit residents is **69**, which is **13 years shorter** than for residents of the Grosse Pointe area, just a few miles away.

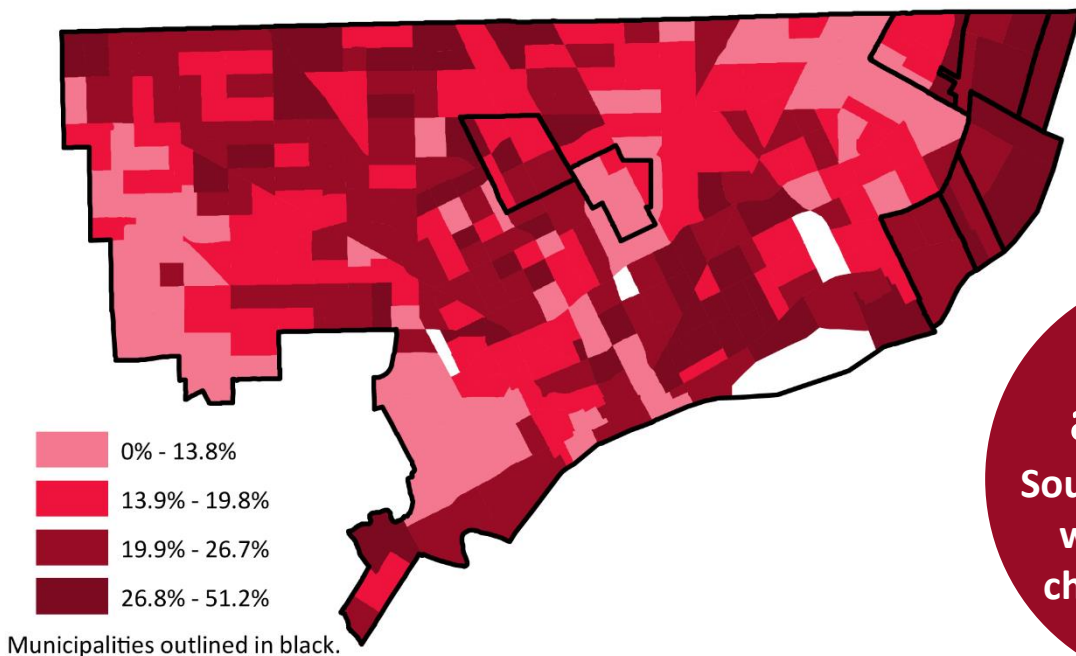

Caregiving



Michigan has an estimated **1.3 million family caregivers** who provide **1.2 billion hours of care** per year.

Social Connections

On average, older adults (age 60+) spend **half of their waking hours (7 hours per day) alone**. For older adults living alone, this number climbs to over **10 hours per day**.



1-in-3 older adults (age 65+) in the DAAA region **live alone**.

Depression occurs in **7% of the older adult population**, but is likely underdiagnosed and undertreated. Depression is related to **poorer health outcomes** in other areas, such as lung disease, hypertension and diabetes.



Technology use is becoming more common among older adults. **67%** use the **internet**, **51%** have home **broadband**, and **42%** have a **smartphone**.
