 - i. *Intro*
 1. Shortening intro paragraph or adding breaks
 - ii. *Questions for PLWH*
 1. Add nurse practitioner & primary care doctor instead of "primary care provider"
 2. Using "living with HIV" or "not living with HIV" instead of HIV+/-
 3. Add "I don't know" as an option for diagnosis and have it route questions the same as "no"
 4. #17: Can change to/add "Do you have healthcare coverage that pays for all or part of your HIV care?"
 - a. Add an option for "I don't have coverage"
 - iii. *Questions for those Not Living with HIV or Not Sure*

1. **Action Item:** Need questions specific to PEP— Todd and Adam
 - a. Community's awareness & ability to access
 - b. "Did you know there's a medication you can take ..."
 - c. Number 35: Ask how people are accessing PrEP, and include an option about PAPI
 - d. Number 33: Add option about insurance/being uninsured

III. Situational Analysis (see slides)

a. Epi Overview

- i. 2018: 185 new infections (22.7 per 100,000)
 1. Across Ohio the rate is 8.5; Hamilton is much higher
- ii. 2019: 168 new infections
 1. Increase in number of females and decrease in males
 2. More diagnoses of women than previous years
- iii. 25-40 year-olds is a large portion of the diagnoses are
- iv. 3213 PLWHA in Hamilton as of Dec 31, 2018
- v. Continues to be a racial disparity in HIV
 1. Highest rate was for those who consider themselves multi-race
- vi. Male-to-male sexual contact is still the highest risk factor
- vii. Injection drug use is the 2nd largest risk factor for those newly diagnosed

b. Response Overview

- i. Flow of Dollars
 1. CDC/HRSA/Ohio General Revenue Fund are biggest funding sources
 2. Part B \$ flow from HRSA to ODH to programs like Caracole and thru OHDAP for PLWHA
 - a. ODH may apply on behalf of an org
