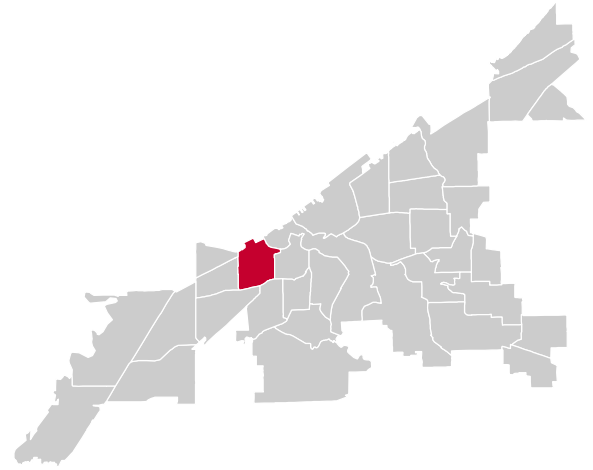

## Food Bank Benefits Eligibility



**3 in 5 Detroit Shoreway residents, 6,518 total,** live at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, which means they are eligible to receive food bank benefits.
