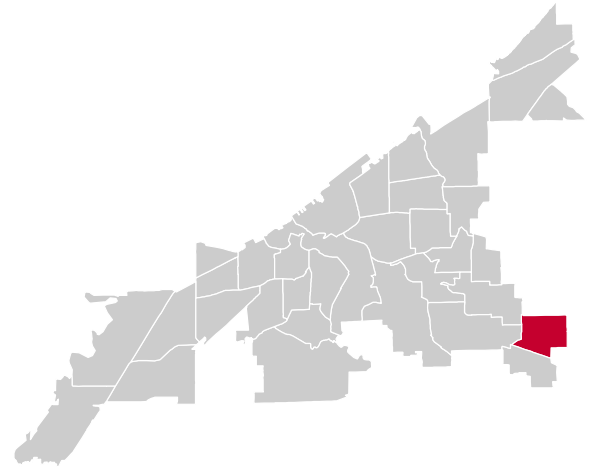

## Food Bank Benefits Eligibility



**2 in 5 Lee-Harvard residents, 4,615 total,** live at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, which means they are eligible to receive food bank benefits.

## Internet Access
